On consideration whereof It is ~~expressly~~ the Opinion of the Court
that the said Garrut & Johnson are guilty of the Burglary & Felony
afores^d And that for the same they ought to be tried at the next
additional Session of the Gen^l Court to be held in Richmond on the
first of October next

and thereupon they are remanded to
Lair.
