# **Richmond Education Compact Overview**

The Education Compact establishes a shared commitment to organizational collaboration and transformational improvement in the lives of the city's children. It is a structure for collaboration to support shared goals, strategies, and priorities to meet the needs of the "whole child" through:

Quarterly meetings between the City Council, RPS School Board, Mayor and Superintendent, as well as appropriate administrative staff from the City and the school division to discuss shared interests and issues related to children and families in Richmond. These meetings will facilitate regular communication, information-sharing, and dialogue among elected officials concerning issues for our children and youth, to build shared understanding of the needs and strategies for addressing them.


**Monthly Children's Cabinet meetings** of city and school organizational and agency leaders that serve children and youth, with a focus on the city and school system's supports to children ensure the foundation for educational and lifelong success. These meetings will facilitate effective implementation of shared priorities; identify opportunities for collaboration and collective solutions.

**Education Compact Team meetings** to give community stakeholders a voice in building community-wide solutions to our most urgent challenges. The Education Compact Team will support the development of a comprehensive approach to the health, wellbeing, and learning readiness of the whole child by

- exploring current needs, best and promising practices, strategies, policies and proposals for supporting the whole child within and outside our community
- building alignment between the city and school system's efforts to support students
- making nonbinding recommendations to council, the mayor or the school board

The ECT is comprised of three members of the Council appointed by the Council; three members of the School Board appointed by the School Board; two members of the administrative leadership of the City, appointed by the Mayor; two members of the administrative leadership of the school division, appointed by the Superintendent; six members representing the state government and the business, philanthropic, non-profit, civic, and academic communities of the city, appointed by the Mayor; and six members who are parents, teachers, students or staff in the school division, appointed by the School Board.
